Service-Learning Course Designation

As you plan for your fall courses, if you embed a community project, please apply for the Service-Learning (SL) Designation on your course. Course instructors can apply throughout the year, however for fall 2023 courses, apply now. Learn more and <u>click here to apply</u>.

The service-learning (SL) designation allows students to intentionally seek out courses that include a high-impact practice. <u>High-impact educational</u>

practices have been proven to be significantly beneficial for students of all backgrounds. Other benefits include:

- The process assures best practices for service-learning;
- Students can identify which courses include a community project;
- UNI is a Carnegie Classified Institution for Community Engagement and to uphold this classification we must demonstrate course based service-learning (we are preparing for re-classification).
