Service-Learning Courses

Here is a list of <u>Fall 2024 Service-Learning courses</u>. If you have embedded a community service project into your fall course, but don't see it listed, please apply for the designation. Email Julianne Gassman at <u>gassman@uni.edu</u> your course syllabus (the formal application process is being updated).

The service-learning (SL) designation allows students to intentionally seek out courses that include a high-impact practice. High-impact educational practices

have been proven to be significantly beneficial for students of all backgrounds. Other benefits include:

- The process assures best practices for service-learning;
- Students can identify which courses include a community project;
- UNI is a Carnegie Classified Institution for Community Engagement and to uphold this classification we must demonstrate course based service-learning (we are preparing for re-classification).
