Service-Learning/Live Client Project (Curricular)

- Project must be part of a course
- More than one project can be entered per course
- Faculty, staff, and/or students can exhibit a project

Student Organization/Student Group Project (Co/Extra-Curricular Activity)

- Project is a part of any student organization, association, or group
- More than one project can be entered per group
- Advisor and/or students can exhibit project

Research-Based Project

- Project must be research-based
- Project can be part of a course, internship, or co/extra-curricular activity
- More than one project can be entered per person/course
- Faculty, staff, and/or students can exhibit a project

Individual Student Project/Internship (Students only)

- Project exhibits a student's individual efforts and service to a community, local, or global
- Project is not a part of a course or student group
- Project can be part of an internship

Commitment to Service (Faculty/Staff Only)

- Project exhibits an individual/centers/institutes efforts and service to a community, local, or global
- Project is not a part of a course or student group



Please Note

- People's Choice: On the day of the event, all attendees will be encouraged to vote for their favorite project. The People's Choice Awardee will receive \$300, sponsored by Veridian Credit Union, to be used towards the project.
- \$250, sponsored by Veridian Credit Union, will be awarded to all other category winners to be used toward the project.
- Individuals and groups should enter their project in one of the award categories and select two alternative categories in rank order
- Projects can be local to the Cedar Valley to global, highlighting service in another country.
- Projects (curricular and co/extra-curricular) can date back to summer 2024.

Evaluation Criteria

Presenters must have a prepared narrative and be able to respond to questions.

Presentations will be evaluated on the ability to demonstrate:

- Clear and meaningful objective of the projects
- Validity of projects: does it meet actual community needs?
- Actions taken (a description of project)
- Results/impact of projects
- Connection to coursework, career, or guiding principles and mission of UNI
- Long-term goals
