If you are teaching a course with a community-engaged project, please apply to have the course designated as Service-Learning:

- The process assures best practices for service-learning;
- Students can identify which courses include a community project;
- You won't need to report this in the Community Engagement Database

UNI is a Carnegie Classified Institution for Community Engagement and to uphold this classification we must demonstrate course based service-learning (we are preparing for re-classification).
